Message from the President

June marks the end of our AAUW branch year. For my final President's Message, I'd like to focus on our branch's highs...getting back together after a long time apart, and accomplishing some amazing things.

It seems like ages ago that we kicked off our year with a board retreat where we set priorities for the year. We decided to focus on our members by hosting interesting programs, encouraging participation and leadership, and finding ways to retain our members. We weren't sure how we'd do this, but we decided to move ahead safely and carefully.

We focused on Membership Engagement a couple of ways. First was the implementation of our monthly phone calls to members by several board members and committee chairs with the goal of talking with each member once a month. We received very positive feedback from those we talked with. Next, we continued the program to formally reach out to those we knew were hurting in our branch, due to illness, death, or other issues. The goal of both of these activities was to let members know that we care.

Our August in-person picnic to welcome our members and friends back was well received. We invited members who had recently left the branch, and paid tribute to those who had passed, including several spouses. Just being able to gather in person in a safe way, was such a gift.

Starting in September, we held some fantastic programs thanks to Kathy Cunningham. We met via Zoom when it didn't feel quite safe enough to meet in person, but also held several in-person events. Highlights were our annual holiday lunch at the Cama Beach Café, the Debbie Dimitre performance featuring Alice Paul at the Utsalady Ladies' Aid Building, and presentations by Mary Jennings about local history and the Sound Water Stewards.

One of my favorite programs was the May presentation of the STEM High School Scholars and introduction of our 2022 Tech Trek campers. I heard it said several times, and strongly agree, that the future looks bright when we meet these young women and learn of their accomplishments. So impressive.

Of course the biggest highlight of all was the great success of our **Purses** with **Purpose** event. Led by Gay Campbell and Jackie DeFazio, along with their hard-working team of committee chairs and members, we accomplished something truly to be proud of. While the final numbers are still being sorted, it appears that even in the middle of a pandemic, with fewer attendees than past years, we may have had the most successful event ever. Thanks to the generosity and hard work of you and our community, we will be able to continue sponsoring Tech Trek Campers and helping young women through generous college scholarships.

So, there is much to celebrate! We came a long way this year, but there is plenty to do next year. One area I'm looking forward to is learning more about Diversity, Equity and Inclusion, which is a focus area of our national organization. Katie Farrey is chairing this committee, and will work with the board to find ways for us to learn more about this as a branch.

Finally, I want to thank you for the privilege of serving as your President. I will now pass the leadership baton on to Nancy Voelckers. I know that we have a great team of leaders that will work with her to make next year a success too. I can't wait!

Now that our branch year is almost over, it is time to renew. Emails from AAUW National with instructions on how to do that should have been received. You'll notice in the email that there is a change in the online process. A new National data base has been established called the AAUW National Community Hub, which replaces the old



Membership Services Database (MSD). Using the Community Hub to renew will allow you to pay with a debit or credit card. It takes a little time to set up your account, but once you have, it is a good resource for address changes, updates to degrees earned, making donations, etc.

If you haven't already set up an account there, you can do so by scrolling below the blue login button and clicking "Forgot Your Password?" at the bottom. Enter your email address, then click "Reset Your Password" to receive your login email. If you don't receive an email within 20 minutes, please contact connect@aauw.org. After you receive the email, enter your email address and then "Create and Confirm your Password" to access your Personal Snapshot.

Once you are within your Personal Snapshot, click the blue RENEW button at the bottom to renew your national membership (\$67) and add your branch **(WA9003-Stanwood-Camano)** (\$24) and state memberships (\$10)!

If you choose not to renew with the new Community Hub, the second option is to send a check for \$101 made out to AAUW Stanwood-Camano to our mailing address: P.O. Box 2652, Stanwood, WA 98292. We hope that you will join us for another great year. There is much to look forward to: the summer picnic, in person meetings and programs, our wonderful holiday lunch, and most importantly, helping the girls and young women of our community have a better future!

Helen Keller's words say it all. The estimated results of PWP 2022 indicate that we will have added approximately \$52,000 to the Stanwood-Camano AAUW Scholarship Account thanks to the generosity of:

- local area businesses via sponsorships (14) and donations (42),
- auction guests/bidders, who bought raffle tickets and purses and raised their paddles for Fund-a-Scholar,
- the Stillaguamish Tribe who contributed \$5,000 for scholarships, and
- branch members who contributed or funded beautiful new purses and/ or encouraged family and friends to find new/gently used purses.

Over the next two years we will be able to fund as many as six scholarships of \$6,000 each to local students who have completed at least two years of college and require financial assistance to complete their degrees and twenty Tech Trek camperships for local girls moving from seventh to eighth grade.

How do we say thank you to all of you who contributed your time, energy, and resources to PWP 2022? We'll start with our 14-member Steering Committee, each one of whom oversaw a critical aspect of the event and stuck with us through all the ups and downs of planning during a pandemic. Thank you, also, to each of you who contributed purses or other items, solicited donations, purchased tables/tickets, helped with set up and/or take down, worked on the day of the event. Working together, we proved that women's purses do indeed have purpose and power.

On May 12, our branch honored junior year high school girls from Stanwood, Lakewood and Arlington High Schools for their exceptional academic abilities in STEM coursework (Science, Technology, Engineering and Math).

The girls were nominated by their faculty and counselors. After hearing comments about the proficiencies in each discipline for which the students were nominated, each girl received a certificate and a digital charging station. Over 50 people attended the dessert reception sponsored by the Branch.



Stanwood High School honorees are Lael ten Hoopen (Engineering), Lindsey Khoury (Science), Maggie Flickner (Technology) who also was the program speaker sharing her past experiences as a Tech Trek camper and Counselor, and Quinn Weller (Math).

Lakewood High School students are Olivia Hayes (Technology), Maia Brown (Math), and Helena Burroughs, double honored for both Science and Engineering.

Arlington High School honorees include Morrigan Havely (Math), Ella Larson (Science), Charlotte Wiktorowicz (Technology), and Jamie Kinney (Engineering).

STEM Program Coordinator, Kathy Cunningham, noted that all of the STEM honorees are impressively goal oriented, achieving the highest 4 point GPAs, with several engaged in Running Start to achieve an AA degree as well as high school diploma next year, serving in Student Leadership and Varsity Level Athletics, with time to engage in community and church activities.

But Alva also defied convention for women of her time, asserting power within her marriage and becoming a leader in the women's suffrage movement.
